HOUSING RULES IN FINLAND AND MAIN CONTRACTS

Tenancy agreement, electricity contract and home insurance

The housing company rules and regulations are a set of common rules that each tenant should comply with. They aim at increasing the comfort of living and at promoting good relationships between tenants. Kindly observe these rules in your daily living.

- TENANCY AGREEMENT (VUOKRASOPIMUS): When renting a
 home in Finland, always conclude the lease in writing. The
 lease agreement contains information on, for example,
 the monthly rent, the rent security deposit and how to
 terminate the agreement. www.infofinland.fi
- HOME INSURANCE (KOTIVAKUUTUS): In Finland, most landlords require you take out home insurance when you rent a home. Home insurance covers, for example, damage to your furniture and other articles. You should ask for a quote from several insurance companies. Keep your insurance policy active for the entire duration of your stay in the home. www.infofinland.fi
- ELECTRICTY CONTRACT (SÄHKÖSOPIMUS): When moving to an apartment you have to have valid electricity contract the latest starting from the day you want to move in. You can compare electricity providers and their prices here when adding your postal code: www.sahkonhinta.fi.

Energy transfer cost: keep in mind that in almost every case, there is also an energy transfer cost that you might have to pay. This will come automatically from the local energy provider (which is not always the same as the electricity provider you make a contract with).



TELEPHONE AND INTERNET SUBSCRIPTION

When you buy a telephone subscription in Finland, you get a Finnish phone number. Many companies sell telephone subscriptions. When you take out a telephone subscription, you must have a Finnish personal identity code and an address in Finland.

Normally, you must also provide information on your payment behaviour, in other words, that you have paid your bills and that you don't have a payment default entry recorded in your credit history. Otherwise, you need to make an advance payment for the subscription.

You can also buy a Pre-paid subscription. A Pre-paid card has a certain sum charged into it beforehand which you use to make phone calls. Pre-paid subscriptions are sold, for example,

at R-kiosks, some supermarkets or over the internet. (See also InfoFinland website: www.infoFinland.fi)

FURNITURE AND EVERYDAY NEEDS

Stores to buy furniture and other every day needs.

- BIGGEST STORE is Ikea Kuopio (www.ikea.com) in the Matkus Shopping center (www.matkusshoppingcenter.fi).
- SECOND HAND SHOPS: there are a lot of different kind of second-hand shops in North Savo. Almost every city has its own second-hand shop. And you can ask for local flee markets (kirpputori).
- BIGGER SECOND HAND SHOPS, also with furniture are:

COMING TO NORTH SAVO AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT

 KUOPIO AIRPORT: Visiting address: Lentokentäntie 275A, 70900 Toivala, (www.finavia.fi)

Terminal is open according to flight schedules. Bus line 40 operates between the airport and Kuopio city center. And there is taxi service as well. Read more here on how to get to the airport: customerservice.finavia.fi.

- RAILWAY STATION: There are railway stations for example in bigger cities like Kuopio, lisalmi and Varkaus and also in Suonenjoki, Siilinjävi and Lapinlahti. See train schedules, ticket prices and railway station addresses on the Finnish Railways: www.vr.fi.
- LONG DISTANCE BUSSES: If you want to travel from one city to another, you can check the bus timetables and prices on Matkahuolto's website: www.matkahuolto.fi.
- PUBLIC TRANSPORT INSIDE THE CITIES: Bigger cities have
 their own public transport buses that you can use to move
 from one place to another within the city. Check the public
 transport services on the website of your own city. Be aware:
 although you can pay nearly everthing with credit card in
 Finland, single tickets in busses have to be paid often only
 with cash! However, you can buy a single ticket without cash
 using mobile application.

DO YOU HAVE CHILDREN?

How to register them to the kindergarten or school

- DAY-CARE ("PÄIVÄHOITO"): Early childhood education ("varhaiskasvatus") is intended for children under school age. Municipalities offer early childhood education at day-care centres ("päiväkoti"). There are also private day-care centres.
- PRESCHOOL EDUCATION ("ESIOPETUS", "ESIKOULU"):
 According to the law, all children must attend preschool education for one year before compulsory education begins. Preschool education is free-of-charge. During the day, the child will receive a free meal.
- COMPREHENSIVE EDUCATION: All children go to school, because according to the law, all children must receive comprehensive education ("peruskoulu"). A child usually starts school in the year when he/she turns 7.
- CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUPS: Parishes, municipalities and organisations hold playgroups for children and families.
 Playgroups usually last a couple of hours/day. Playgroups provide organised play, singing, crafts and other activities.
